Re: **New Security Certificate for the Automated Dispatch and Messaging System (ADaMS)**

The current security certificate will expire on Friday, February 3, 2012. In order to maintain secure access to the ADaMS, a new security certificate will be required.

Participants who receive dispatches and/or directives from the Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO) system controllers will need to make a request for a **new** security certificate by sending an email to Chelsea.Scalzo@aeso.ca. The current URL <https://adams-2010.aeso.ca/dt-web/> will not change and the new security certificate will be valid for 1 year.

All security certificate requests must be received from the corporate contact as registered in the Energy Trading System (ETS). Corporate contacts as listed in the ETS may be viewed by accessing the [Participant List](#) on the AESO website.

It is the corporate contact's responsibility to ensure the new security certificate is installed on all systems within their organization that require access to the ADaMS by Friday, February 3, 2012. ***Non-compliance as a result of the corporate contact failing to distribute the new certificate to all required personnel will not be excused due to the change in certificates.***

Attempts to access the ADaMS using the old security certificate after Friday, February 3, 2012 will result in an error message indicating that the site does not exist.
